



Hosting and email installation services

Introduction

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A Brief Explanation of Hosting Services

Web Hosting: Think of web hosting as what enables your website to exist and be discoverable on the internet. This service actually houses your website and is responsible for maintaining its connection to the internet. Your web hosting service might also include an option to activate email hosting, but you have to tell your provider that you want to do that.

Domain Hosting: This is one of the most confusing services involved in getting your business website up and running. A domain is a unique name, like amazon.com, that identifies your website. Getting your site online can only happen if you have a domain name registered for it.

Email Hosting: While it's usually included with a web hosting package, email hosting is a separate service that allows you to set up a custom email address and use it to send and receive emails. The email domain name you use will match your website.

For example, if your site is mywebsite.com, then your email address would be something like yourname@mywebsite.com. Having an email address that matches your website makes your business look more professional. Email hosting keeps your email safe and secure and makes it accessible from anywhere you have an internet connection.

Although people usually get email hosting and web hosting services from the same provider, you don't have to. You can have email hosting alone, with no website, which means you can get each of your services from the provider that you prefer.

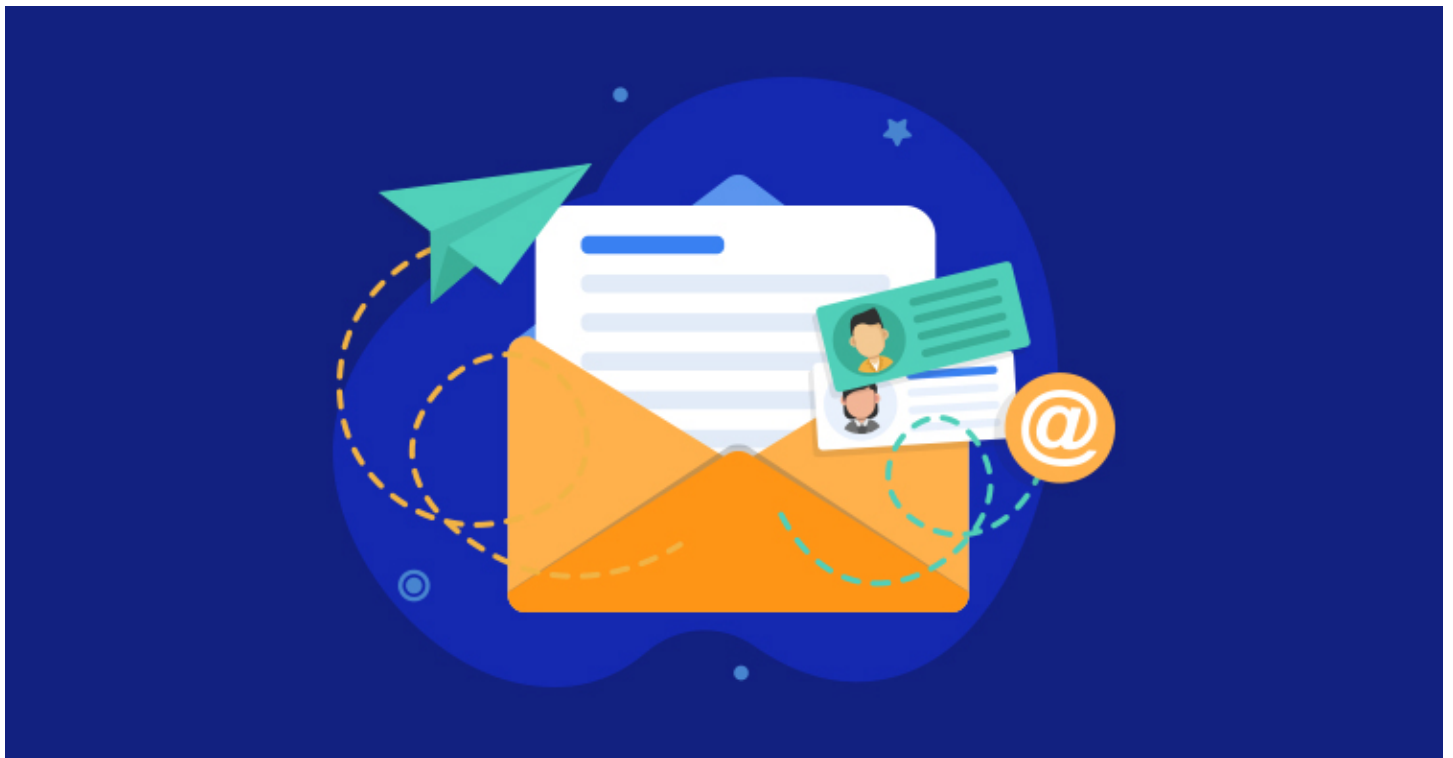
The Benefits of Email Hosting

There are several answers to that question. The first and most significant benefit of email hosting is the email domain naming conventions that you can use. You can have email addresses that fit your business name. For example, if you run an online flower delivery business, an email like `bob@bobsflowershop.com` would look much more professional than `bobsflowershop@yahoo.com`.

Another benefit of email hosting is security. Email hosting can be more secure than free email services. The large providers like Google and Yahoo, while offering relatively secure services, present a more attractive target to hackers simply because of their size.

Using an email hosting provider also gives you more control over the service you're getting. As a paying customer, you will have direct access to the support staff of your email hosting company, so you'll be able to contact them if you have any technical or security issues.



Email Hosting Options

If your email hosting provider offers any of the following options, you should consider taking advantage of them.

Online archiving: Access to online email archives gives you a historical record of all your business communications. Some services offer 5 to 10 years of backups that you can access directly via a login portal.

Multiple mailboxes: If you have a growing business, you'll need the ability to create mailboxes on the fly. Make sure that your email host gives you all the mailboxes you need to support your operations.

People commonly use separate mailboxes to categorizing emails based on business functions—you can have an admin mailbox for website and service queries, a billing mailbox for payments and accounts, an info mailbox for general communications, and a bulk mailer address for advertising and campaigns.

Bundle deals: If you find a service provider that offers web, domain, and email hosting in one package, you can sometimes get better pricing than if you purchased each service separately.

Mailbox storage: Find out what your mailbox size limits are. A mailbox for a typical business needs to be able to store large files and huge quantities of mail, so make sure that your mailbox storage is appropriate for your needs.

Room to grow: You never know exactly how much email storage or how many mailboxes you'll need with an online business. Having multiple email addresses can streamline your business operations and improve its image, but the email accounts will add up quickly. Large email attachments will fill up your allotted storage space faster than you may anticipate. It's important to choose an email hosting provider that will be able to meet your needs as your business grows.
